Illinois Heavily Relies on Grants for Service and Program Delivery

- Grants help build and repair our statewide roads and infrastructure
- Grant agreements with community-based organizations, not-for-profits and others carry out services and programs on behalf of the State of Illinois
 - Grantees deliver essential services to the most vulnerable citizens including the development of children
 - Grantees provide training and skill development to those entering or adapting to the workforce
- Illinois' program and service success is directly related to the success of its grantees



Illinois Receives and Awards a Significant Amount of Grant Funding

- Illinois spends approximately \$26.6B in federal financial assistance annually – in FY21, \$62.4B was spent due to increased federal Coronavirus funding
- Illinois distributes approximately \$15.8B in state-issued award agreements between state agencies and grantees
- Approximately \$12B of the state-issued awards are used for match or maintenance of effort required by federal funding
- FY21 and FY22 capital funding and COVID-related federal funds substantially increased the number and amount of grants awarded
 - FY22 Capital Budget includes approximately \$19.7B in new and re-appropriated grant funds (4400 and 4900 – all grants)
 - FY21 Coronavirus Relief Fund/CARES Act -- \$1.8B (June 2021 LBOC)



State Grants and State Grant Making Agencies

- “State-issued awards” - financial assistance awarded by a state grant making agency using state, federal pass-through or a combination of these sources of funding
- Nearly 95% of all grant funds expended are administered by 8 grant making agencies – GATA Advisory Agencies
 - DCEO, DHS, DPH, ISBE, IDOT, DCFS, Aging and ICCB
 - ISBE elected to be subject to GATA
- Illinois’ Catalog of State Financial Assistance (CSFA) includes more than 2,500 programs and nearly 38,000 awards to more than 5,500 grantees
 - 47% of grantees receive grants from multiple state agencies

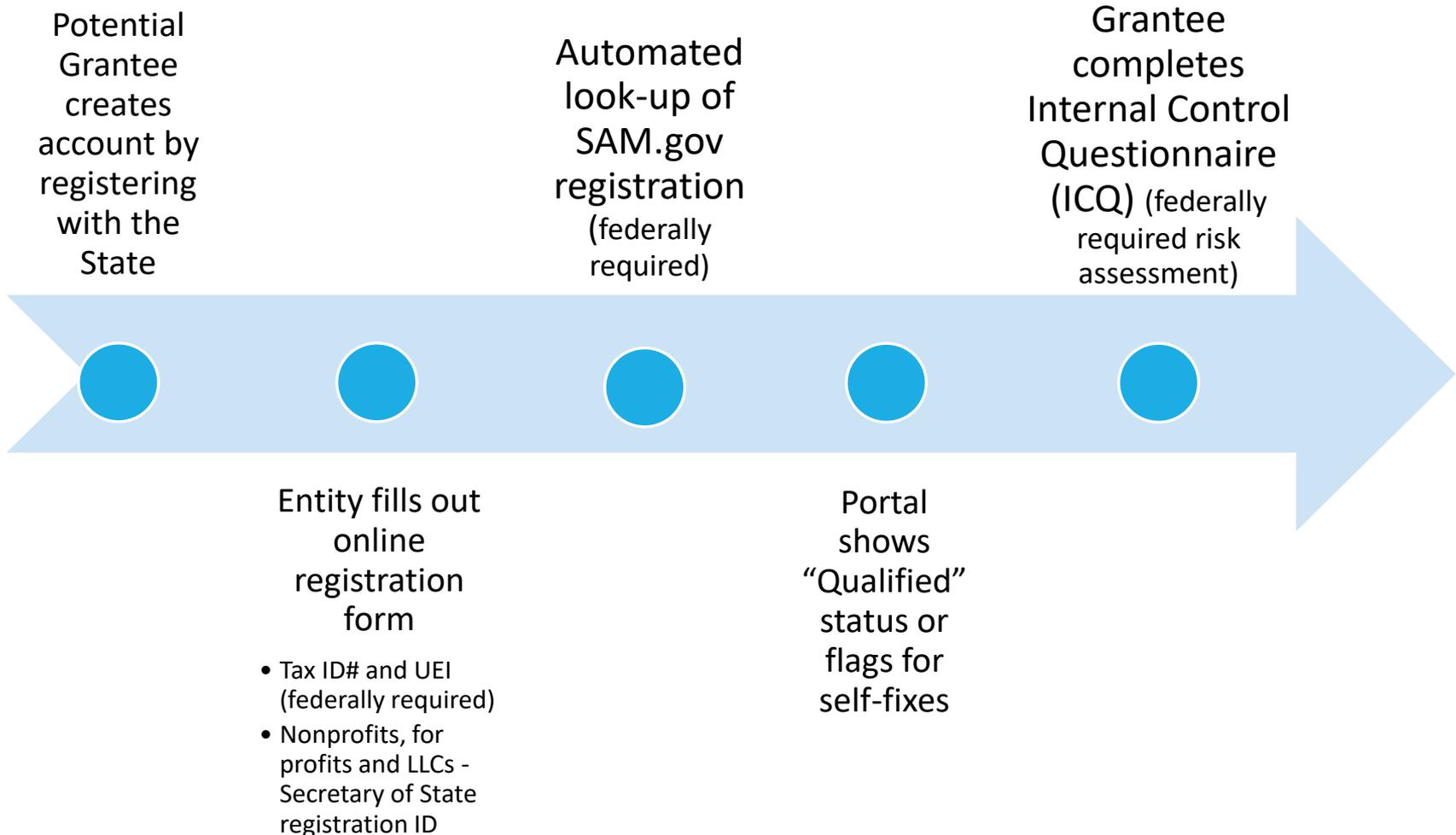
Grant Accountability and Transparency Act (30 ILCS 708)

Grant Application & Award Process

Notice of Grants

- State agency posts Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) in CSFA (grants.Illinois.gov)
- NOFOs are not required for grants when recipients are named in an appropriation bill or if a specific allocation recipient is laid out in statute

Merit Review

- Potential grantees submit applications in response to a NOFO
- Applications are reviewed and evaluated by the awarding agency based on the program evaluation criteria

Award

- Granting agency sends a Notice of State Award (NOSA) to the winning grantee with the terms of the grant award
- Agency and grantee complete a Grant Agreement with the requirements of the grant

Funding

- Once the grant agreement is finalized, program/services and payments to the grantee can begin, following the terms of the agreement



Impact of the GATA Learning Curve

- Centralized GATA frameworks were designed to eliminate duplication
 - Functions are performed once - information shared in GATA systems
 - GATA frameworks should replace what agencies did previously
- GATA frameworks are inter-related and must be used as a “system”
 - Because data is shared, agencies are dependent on each other
- State agency change management - why change?!?
 - While 87% of federal expenditures are tested, 92% of federal programs are not tested in the statewide single audit; administration *assumed* to be compliant
 - GATA systems add visibility to the completion of requirements

GATA's Incremental Implementation

- GATA learning curve continues because pieces are incrementally implemented
 - GATA enhancements require more changes
 - Center of Excellence webinars highlight state agency best practices and testimonials – lots of success stories to build upon!
- Specific issues and concerns must be shared
 - State agencies have not consistently implemented GATA
 - GATA frameworks should be replacing old practices
 - External GATA champions are needed – particularly legislative sponsors



Use of GATA Frameworks

- Is your agency using the CSFA as designed?
- Does your agency maintain supporting documents for all funding opportunities?
- Are competitive applications undergoing a merit review?
- Are all grantees qualified?
- Are there accepted ICQs for each grantee?
- Does the agency require and receive periodic reporting?
- Does the agency enforce the Grantee Compliance Enforcement System (GCES) and utilize Stop Pay status when appropriate?



Governor's Office of Management and Budget GATA Implementation Website

NOTE: Due to high demand, SAM.gov is experiencing processing delays validating entity legal business names and addresses. Help tickets at SAM.gov are handled on a first in first out basis. They advise against reporting the same incident multiple times.
Per M-21-20, entities can apply for funding without an active SAM.gov registration. However, a state agency cannot award a grant to an entity without an active SAM.gov account.

Legislative Action

Legislation to remove GATA frameworks does not remove requirements. Fix the root cause!

- FY22 language added to GATA to require that Coronavirus Relief Fund (State CURE Fund) appropriations not be subject to requirements beyond what 2 CFR 200 requires



Drivers of GATA Legislation

- Human service grantees demanded consistent, federally compliant requirements for all grants – regardless of funding source or organization type - to simplify processes and remove redundancies
- Simultaneously, publicized grant fraud (NRI) and inadequate oversight of public funds drove the enactment of GATA legislation
- GATA became law under Gov. Quinn (2014 30 ILSC 708); sunset removed in 2018 (PA 100-0676)
 - Federal Uniform Guidance, 2 CFR 200, also went into effective 2014
 - Timing leads to perception that GATA established current grant rules
- GATA adopts federal requirements for all state-issued awards driving transparency and accountability for all public funds



GATA Enhancements



Feedback Drives GATA Enhancements

- Grantees - not-for-profits (human services and criminal justice sectors), local governments (counties and municipalities) and universities (U of I, NIU)
 - Grantees make up approximately 40% of GATA Committees
- State agencies – Chief Accountability Officer (CAO) at each agency
 - 8 Advisory Agencies (DCEO, DHS, DPH, ISBE, IDOT, DCFS, Aging and ICCB) award approximately 75% of all grants statewide
 - CAO meetings every other week
- Stakeholder groups - external auditors (working with groups of grantees), legislators, grantee advocates (GFOA, Forefront, Illinois Partners)
 - GATA listening sessions - GATU partnering with state awarding agency



GATA Revisions

- Illinois cannot change the federal rules, but we can improve how we comply with the requirements
- Implemented ListServ functionality in the CSFA
 - Based on a registry, weekly emails communicate NOFOs posted during the prior week
- Enhanced CSFA data fields to automate NOFO writing
- Updating GATA website, <https://grants.illinois.gov>, for more direct access to technical assistance for all users
 - State Grantee Portal New User Guide
 - Translating key documents to Spanish
- Streamlined risk assessment to a single questionnaire (ICQ)



Audit Streamlining

- Audit threshold only includes state-issued awards – direct federal funding was removed from the calculation
- Enhanced Audit Certification Form – simplified language, requires more information regarding auditor
- Streamlined Consolidated Year-end Financial Statement (CYEFR)
 - CYEFR doesn't have to tie to total expenditures
 - Simplified CSFA program expenditure reporting
- Improving user instructions for grantees and grantee auditors, ARRMS Manual



Indirect Cost Rate Election System (ICRES)

- Previously, all grantees were required to work through the CARS system
- Now grantees make indirect cost rate election in ICRES
 - Waive
 - De Minimis
 - Federal Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate Agreement (NICRA)
 - State Negotiated Rate
- Waive and De Minimis, one-time election required
- Federal NICRA, grantee uploads required documents in ICRES
- State Negotiated Rate, once grantee has an award in the CSFA, notification sent to CARS for negotiation process to begin



Improving Equitable Access to Grant Funds

- Recognize the need to make grant funding available to community-based organizations and others with limited grant experience
 - Significant learning curve to understand requirements, submit a competitive application and comply with post-award terms
 - GATA listening sessions and targeted stakeholder groups provide insight
- Expanding the learning management system and grant training curriculum developed by ICJIA and DHS for statewide use
- Goal: Make grant administration support and grant funds accessible to new entities so they can partner with Illinois



AmpliFund

ONE PIECE OF ILLINOIS' GRANT MANAGEMENT
SYSTEM (GMS)

GMS = GATA Frameworks in AmpliFund Software



- Statewide Grant Management System (GMS) includes federal grant requirements, GATA templates and systems and standard workflow through AmpliFund software
- Illinois is in year 4 of a 5-year contract with SHI International for AmpliFund software - \$12.5M total contract
 - Current contract includes 50% vendor configuration support
- AmpliFund will be Illinois' system of record for grant administration for all state agencies under the Governor
 - ISBE elected to be subject to GATA



AmpliFund Incremental Implementation

- SAP integration 7/1/21 – obligation and expenditure data
- Grant making cycles dictate agency implementation timelines
 - 13 agencies are currently using AmpliFund
 - 3 are actively implementing through pilots; 4 have requested additional configuration support
 - DHS, DPH and DCEO are actively engaged in planning; ISBE is on hold
- Vendor led implementation training supports the state agency and grantee user experience
